Call to Order: Marlene McNeese-Ward, Chair, called the meeting to order at 11:40 a.m. by asking for a Moment of Reflection.

Appreciating Our External Committee Members: McNeese-Ward gave certificates to those external members who were present. Williams took a group picture for the archives.

Adoption of the Agenda: Motion: it was moved and seconded (Fuentes, Jr., Lopez-Williams) to adopt the agenda. Motion carried.

Adoption of the Minutes: Motion: it was moved and seconded (Downes, Garza, V.) to adopt the September 11, 2003 minutes with this correction: page one, attendance, second column: should be "MEMBERS ABSENT", not Members Present. Abstentions: Fuentes, Jr., Garza, V., Griffin, Kincaid, King, Jr., Lopez-Williams, Sanders, Urban. Motion carried.

Public Comment: McNeese-Ward pointed out the written Public Comment from M., Miller. Urban announced that he is the President of the Grey Party and they are doing several fundraisers for various HIV/AIDS organizations. He encouraged members to participate. Fuentes, Jr. announced that HACS has been awarded a SAHMSA Grant for Substance Abuse.

Reports from the Committees

ADAP Ad Hoc Committee: Miertschin, Co-Chair, stated that there is nothing new to report.

Quality Assurance Committee: Veronica Garza, Chair, reported on the following: Outcome Measures & Standards of Care Work Group Meetings: FYI: See attached calendar of work group meetings.

Substance Abuse Work Group: FYI: This work group met at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 8, 2003. There will be a report at the November meeting.

CPCDMS Subcommittee Report: Seventeen people attended the October 2, 2003 community meeting. The training was very informative. The next meeting is scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on December 4, 2003.

Comprehensive HIV Planning Committee: Paula Downes, Chair, reported on the following: Needs Assessment Committee: The first Needs Assessment Group (NAG) meeting was held on September 30, 2003. Although attendance was low, the meeting went well. Co-chairs for the NAG are Ken Malone and Tam Kiehnhoff. Partners include: CPG, East Texas CPG, STAGE, HOPWA and the Homeless Coaliton. The work groups co-chairs will be announced at the November 5, 2003 meeting.

Reporting with CDC AIDS Data: The Administrative Agent will be using the CDC AIDS numbers for reports to IIRSA such as the WICY report. Previously, reports were submitted based upon estimates of HIV and AIDS cases. The CDC AIDS numbers will be used for reporting purposes, not necessarily for planning purposes.

Advances in Meds/Treatments: Joe Fuentes, Jr., Chair, reported on the following:

Policy on Adding/Removing Medications: The Council was asked to be aware of the attached, proposed policy on adding or removing medications from the local HIV Medication Program. The Physician Work Group that will be meeting in January or February 2004 will be asked to review and critique the policy before it is sent to the Quality Assurance Committee as a recommendation for inclusion in the "How to Best Meet the Need" process. The purpose of the Physician Work Group is to get ideas on cost containment strategies that could be implemented locally. Malone, after declaring a conflict of interest, expressed concern about creating a drug formulary. Presently medications are not restricted. Costs are controlled by financial eligibility of the clients and monthly caps on the amount each client is allowed to spent. Miertschin agreed with Malone and stated that the current policy provides a safety net with more flexibility than ADAP. Fuentes, Jr. responded that the "policy" is still a working document. The concerns stated have been noted.

Administrative Assessment Committee: No report.

Affected Community Committee: Lesley Lopez-Williams, Chair, made the following reports: Blue Book Work Group: Title II will be reprinting 5,000 copies of the 2003-04 Blue Book.

October Meeting Time and Location: The committee will hold its October meeting at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday October 22, 2003 at the Bering Omega Support Group.

Health Fairs: See attached list. McNeese-Ward stated that she liked the written summaries of the results of each health fair.

Operations Committee: Steven Walker, Chair, reported on the following:

New Council Member Orientation: The Orientation went very well. Five of the six new Council members attended.

Computer Availability: Since two of the donated computers have been returned by individuals going off the Council, there will be a lottery-style drawing for the computers. As always, this equipment is available on loan to Council members. Anyone interested is to give their name to Williams.

2004 Elections: Nominations for officers must be submitted to the Planning Council Support staff one week prior to the November Steering Committee meeting. Nominations for officers will be announced at the November Council meeting.

Priority & Allocations Committee: Sahm, Co-Chair announced that unspent funds will be allocated at the October committee meeting. Since the committee did not meet in September, there was nothing further to report.

Report from Office of Support: Tori Williams, Manager, summarized the attached report.

Report from HIV Services: Elizabeth Love, HIV Services, HCHD, summarized the attached report. The Minority Capacity Building Program targeting substance abuse providers is waiting for Council approval before it can be RFP'ed.

Old Business: None.

New Business

Report from Title III: Miertschin stated that HRSA has granted a \$50,000 supplemental grant to the Harris County Hospital District (HCHD). This money will go toward the continuation of the "New Faces" Campaign. IICHD has also received a \$100,000 grant for a coordinator position at Thomas Street to develop an Adherence Team.

Spokesperson for Title I to STAGE: Boyle stated that the Bylaws have been completed. STAGE membership is low.

CDC Planning and Prevention Group: Walker stated that the Unity Open House is coming up (see attached flyer).

Mayor's Task Force on IIIV/AIDS: McNeese-Ward stated that there will be a Community Forum featuring the Mayoral candidates and other City Council positions, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 16, 2003, at the Shrine of the Black Madonna.

JCPC: The next meeting will be at 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 15, 2003.

SCSN: Miertschin stated that Health Planner Hartranst is now an official member of the SCSN Committee. Work is being done on the Provider Survey.

HOPWA: Farrar stated that the HIV/AIDS Funding Workshop is limited to 200 organizations, and these agencies must be 501 c(3) organizations.

Announcements: McNeese-Ward stated that the US Conference on AIDS would be in Houston in 2004 (see attached flyer). The Planning Group is in the process of selecting officers and committee chairs and needs help. The next meeting will be at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, November 14, 2003, in the City of Houston Health Department at 1115 South Braeswood.

Judith Lahai-Momoh stated that she was the only representative from Texas at a national meeting in Washington D.C. Testimonies were given. There is a need for funding for African-Americans and immigrants. Stipends should be provided for local reviewers.
